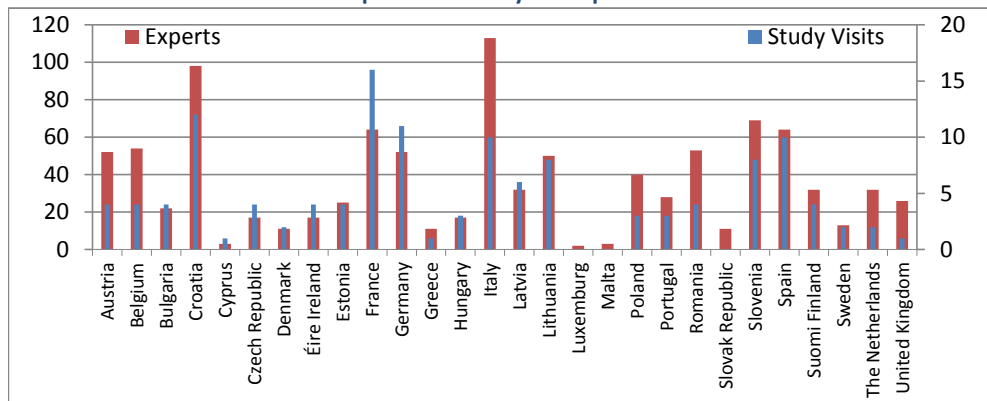

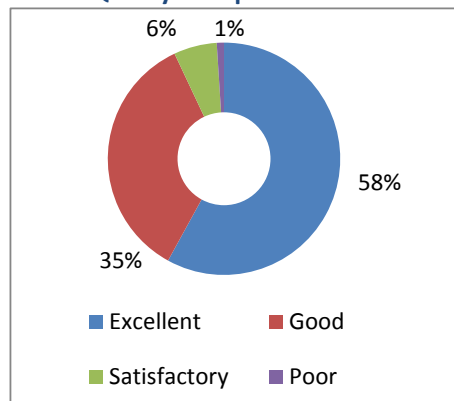

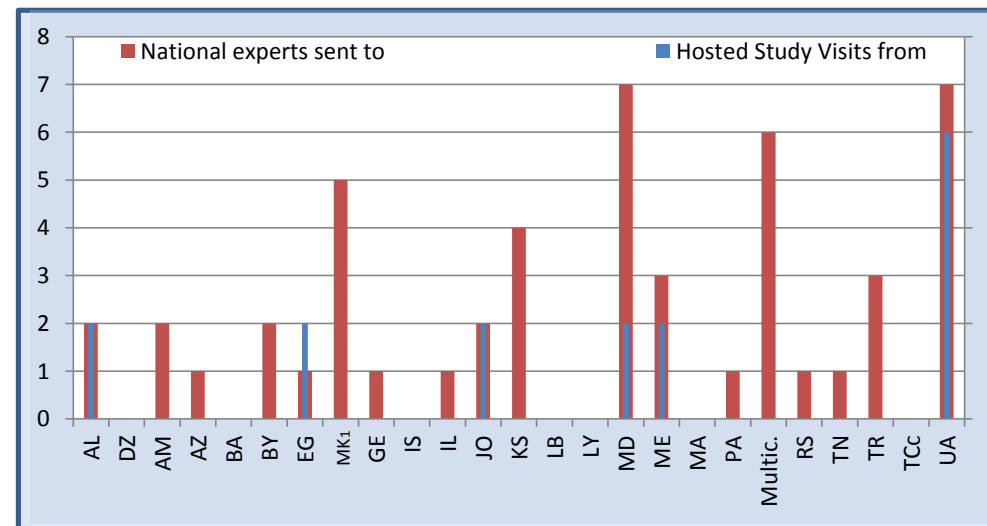
Number of Experts and Study Visits per Member State



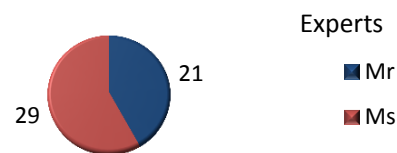
Quality of Experts in 2017
